



6. RADIO FREQUENCY -TIME WARP (ADVANCED)

TYPE OF ACTIVITY: Model Student Broadcast

STANDARDS: 1.1 Conversing, 1.3 Presenting, 2.1 Customs, 3.1 Interdisciplinary Connections, 4.2 Intercultural Comparisons

OBJECTIVES:

- To practice interviewing techniques
- To learn about various historical time periods

TEACHER PREPARATION

Teacher works with a school or city librarian to gather resources for student research.

Teacher writes a list of questions or components student reports must cover.

STUDENT PREPARATION

Each student researches a different time period or topic in the history of the country or countries in which the target language is spoken. For example, a student might research the lives of French children in the 1920s.

Outside of class, students write a radio report or speech that covers their topic.

IN THE LAB

RECORD

Students **RECORD** their report.

COLLECT RECORDINGS

Teacher uses the **COLLECT RECORDING/WORK** feature to collect all of the student audio reports in one folder for grading.



FOLLOW-UP

CLASSROOM

Teacher chooses an exemplary “broadcast” to listen to as a class and discuss.

Students complete a questionnaire on the “broadcast” and submit for grading.
